

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE AND MAINTENANCE OF TECHNO TOP WORKTOPS****PRODUCT:**

High-pressure decorative laminate (HPL) bonded to wood-based substrates (particleboard P2 type) for interior use

**TYPICAL APPLICATION:**

Kitchen and office working surfaces, restaurant and hotels tables, doors and walls covering in public areas.

It is used in ordinary environment, without humidity, with humidity level between 50% and 70% and temperatures between 18°C and 30°C.

**MAINTENANCE:**

To maintain the look and extend the life of the furniture, please consider the instructions below:

**Recommended**

- For regular cleaning, wiping the surface with water and mild detergent is sufficient, but more severe methods such as steam cleaning can be used, solvents such as acetone can be used.
- If countertops are used in hospitals and operating rooms, melamine-based HPL surfaces can be disinfected using any of the usual disinfectants, such as: 70% ethanol, 1% to 5% formalin, 1% to 5% chloramine T.
- Remove any traces of cleaning agent with clean water and wipe the surface until it is completely dry.
- Persistent dirt can be removed with commercially available plastic cleaning agents.
- For cleaning, soft cloths are used, which do not scratch the surface.
- Hard cleaning agents such as anti-lime solutions will be wiped off the counter tops as quickly as possible.
- Always wipe off areas that get wet often, example around the sink.
- The countertops are resistant at dry heat and wet heat, but it is advisable to place a protection before placing the hot pots on the countertop. Over time, a slight change in gloss may occur.

**Not-recommended:**

- Cleaning agents based on acids, ammonia, bleaches or abrasives will be avoided.
- Vinegar-based cleaning agents, resin or cellulose diluents and nitro-diluents are no indicated for these surfaces.
- No cleaning spatula will be used.
- Prevents furniture from getting wet. It should not have long contact with water.
- Countertops are not used as surfaces for cutting food.
- There will be no moving / rubbing objects on the surface of the countertop which can cause scratches
